Many thousands of lives have been changed by Canine Companions service and facility dogs, and it's you, our steadfast community, who helped make these transformative partnerships possible. 2023 was a year of innovation and growth, from evolving training methods to implementing major milestone initiatives. We placed 450 working dogs and surpassed our income goal, raising \$46 million in operating revenue to support greater independence for people with disabilities. At the same time, we were successful in controlling overall expenses despite industry records in veterinary and dog food cost. Our impact is growing, reaching more communities than ever before.

As we complete major goals – including the completion of the impactful Nelson Schulz Canine Health and Wellness Center – we're setting the foundation for our future. In the years to come, we eagerly anticipate creating more human-canine teams, welcoming new members to the Canine Companions family and inspiring another generation of committed supporters to join our enduring and loyal community. In 2023, we built the framework for programs that will keep Canine Companions at the forefront of the service dog industry, while increasing access and inclusion for future generations.

- The prison puppy raising program grew to several new sites throughout the country, adding new incarcerated handlers and bringing greater impact through more engagement with our handlers in custody, integrating our volunteers and staff more fully with our incarcerated community members.



- Our Junior Ambassador Committee brought together young adults from a variety of backgrounds to help guide our goals for engaging the next generation.
- We established a pilot field office in the Puget Sound area of Seattle, Washington, to better serve the Pacific Northwest and bring our mission closer to the community for easier access to our services.
- Our therapy dog program expanded to all six regions of Canine Companions, broadening our impact in communities nationwide.
- The dedication of our young volunteers raising puppies as part of official college clubs continues to grow, with more than 26 clubs at colleges and universities nationwide.

We're truly inspired by your dedicated support as part of the Canine Companions family, now and into the future. As we stand on the cusp of a milestone 50th anniversary of not only the founding of Canine Companions, but the creation of the service dog itself, we reflect on all for which we're grateful. Perfect Matches in Puget Sound

The Keogh family was due to start Team Training to get 12-year-old Luca's service dog when they learned that Luca's father, David, needed chemotherapy. Treatment would begin in just two weeks. With three children with disabilities, the daunting prospect of driving from the Seattle area, where they reside, to Santa Rosa, California, for training would be insurmountable.

“I don't know what magic Canine Companions has, but it was the perfect match.”

Fortunately, the Keoghs would be in the very first class to graduate from the Puget Sound Field Office in Seattle, Washington, a new Canine Companions outpost right in their backyard.

“It wouldn't have been possible for us to get Luca's service dog without being so close to home,” Luca's mom Sarah says. “The kids are homeschooled, and Luca is at high risk for respiratory viruses – our small, local class was the only reason it all worked out.”

The field office hosts dogs in professional training, with the dogs spending nights and weekends fostered by local volunteers while training each day with Canine Companions' instructors.

Luca found a life-changing best friend in Service Dog Atticus.

“I don't know what magic Canine Companions has, but it was the perfect match,” Sarah recalls. “Atticus was meant for Luca.”

Since graduating, the Keoghs have started to see the profound impact Atticus is making. Atticus joined Luca, who has spina bifida, for two extensive surgeries and hospital stays, helping with recovery and motivating during therapies.

“He's the best dog ever,” Luca says. “He comforts me when I have surgery.” Atticus also helps Luca to be more independent by doing tasks Luca used to rely on his parents to do, like retrieving his shoes, carrying his water bottle and picking up dropped pencils.

“We couldn't be more grateful,” says Sarah. “Atticus is paving the way for Luca's independent future.”

Along their journey, the Puget Sound Field Office will be right around the corner to offer support and follow-up services, ensuring that independence is always within reach for this perfect partnership and those to come.

The Puget Sound Field Office was established as a pilot program to expand our reach in areas farther from our training centers. It brings Team Training, client follow-up services and volunteer support into communities for minimal disruption to normal routines. We are grateful for the Aldarra Foundation for their generous support of this program.



Rehabilitative Justice



Canine Companions proudly partners with correctional facilities across the nation to create a double-the-impact program to raise future service dogs, while providing rehabilitative experience for individuals in custody. The prison puppy raising program reduces recidivism, fosters job skills and provides opportunities for handlers returning to life outside correctional facilities.

At one of the most well-known facilities in the country, San Quentin Rehabilitation Center in California, incarcerated individuals now have a path to recovery. They welcomed their first Canine Companions puppies, Artemis and Wendel, in the spring of 2023. The program has quickly expanded and is making a dramatic difference for the men involved.

“It’s real rehabilitation. The possibilities are endless.”

“This is groundbreaking for us. To have this here in San Quentin, it’s real rehabilitation,” a handler says. “The possibilities are endless.”

Since 2009, more than 50 puppies have passed through Federal Medical Center Carswell, a correctional facility in Texas.

The partnership has not only transformed the lives of clients paired with expertly trained service dogs but also achieved a remarkable zero percent recidivism rate for the 300 incarcerated women who assisted in Carswell’s puppy raising program – a trend seen at most of our partner facilities.

“We raise these puppies to be service dogs after they leave us, but, they start working the day they come into our lives,” one Carswell handler states. “I hurt so many people by my actions in my past and it feels so good to be able to send something positive out into the world. Being a part of this program has taught me skills that I’ve also applied to my personal life and will use when I’m able to go home.”

Puppies raised in our prison programs benefit from the intensive hands-on training handlers can provide in a correctional facility and are supported by Canine Companions puppy raisers in the surrounding community. Together, the prison puppy raising program has helped provide hundreds of service dogs to people with disabilities and made a positive impact on the rehabilitation of thousands of individuals in custody across the nation.

Generous Giving for Generations

Every great organization is built on a solid foundation. The foundation of extraordinary service dogs relies on an exceptional breeding program with outstanding breeder dogs.

Bill and Mary-Louise “M-L” Reinking are no strangers to our breeding program – or our wonderful breeder dogs. In 1997, the Reinkings volunteered to care for a black Labrador named Bobby, who would go on to father many successful service dogs and breeder dogs that would shape Canine Companions for generations.

Bobby passed away at the age of 14, but never truly left Bill and M-L’s lives – the couple became volunteer breeder caretakers again for Ross, Bobby’s direct descendant. Recently, Marsh

became the Reinkings’ third breeder dog, already contributing to the future of our organization. The Reinkings are devoted to creating future service dogs as volunteer breeder caretakers and are committed to supporting canine wellness into the future.

Over the decades, the generosity of the Reinkings has been significant. Bill and M-L have left Canine Companions in their estate as Heritage Society members, funded essential veterinary equipment and supported the new Canine Health and Wellness Center. They donated the Ross Mobile and Ross Mobile II – critical vehicles for transporting puppies and dogs to and from the Canine Health and Wellness Center, including after surgeries and other medical procedures.

Bobby’s legacy continues to serve the mission through the Reinkings’ gift of Bobby’s Place, a covered patio area on our Santa Rosa campus, used for year-round training, meetings and staff relaxation.

Bobby, Ross and Marsh are important parts of our robust breeding program that wouldn’t be the same without the generous contributions from the Reinkings – now and for decades to come.

With sincere gratitude, we thank Bill and M-L, and all our volunteers and donors. The impact on our mission from their generosity will be seen for years – through state-of-the-art breeding and veterinary care and our life-changing puppies with a special destiny.





Operation Independence

As a fire support specialist in the U.S. Army, it was Corporal David Medina's job to penetrate enemy lines, face harsh hand-to-hand combat and call in airstrikes. It was a job that required efficiency, resilience and courage in the face of danger.

On a 2010 mission in Iraq, David was wounded in combat when his vehicle struck an improvised explosive device. He returned to civilian life with physical injuries and hearing loss. War also left its invisible wounds.

"Coming home was a different kind of mission," David says. "I saw things no one wants to see. When the adrenaline was gone, I really felt the injuries. The physical and psychological change was 180 degrees."

At a military retreat, David and his wife, Lymarie, learned that a service dog could be a game-changer for David. In 2014, he was matched with Canine Companions Service Dog Lombard. Lombard helped David regain his lost independence by assisting with physical tasks, from retrieving crutches and dropped items, to opening doors.

"Lombard was amazing," Lymarie recalls. "He intuitively responded to David's anxiety and provided more awareness of his environment. David didn't have to rely on me anymore."

Picking up where Lombard left off after eight years of devoted service, Service Dog Kellen is the perfect partner to meet David's needs. Kellen assists David with the physical tasks Lombard did so faithfully, tugging off socks and turning on lights.

However, Kellen provides even more sense of safety and peace of mind for David, thanks to his training to mitigate symptoms of PTSD. Tasks like anxiety interruption and creating a buffer in crowds have been life-altering for David's ability to connect with the world around him.

"When we're in public, I can manage better because Kellen makes that space. I feel more at ease," David remarks. "I am more comfortable in the world because of Kellen."

Now, David can participate in his life more fully – doing activities he loves, like kayaking and cycling, spending time with his family and making new memories – knowing that no matter what he needs, Kellen has his back.

Paws for Therapy

A patient had just received a devastating cancer diagnosis when Sara, the Labrador Retriever, got to work at Providence St. Mary's Medical Center. Sara knew just what to do; she laid her head across the patient's lap and just listened. The terrified patient explained that those moments were more effective than the pain medicine she was receiving – she felt heard.

Sara is a Canine Companions therapy dog with her partner April Schafer, director of patient experience, bringing joy and comfort to staff and patients with her wagging tail and intuitive demeanor.

Sara was born and raised to be a future service dog, but the professional training staff at Canine Companions determined that Sara's perfect fit wasn't to become a task-trained service or facility dog. However, she was a perfect candidate for our therapy dog program. Therapy dogs like Sara still thrive with a job to do – especially one that involves a heavy dose

of snuggling and love. The medical center was hoping for a helper, just like Sara, to boost morale and bring smiles to their community.

April and Sara became a therapy dog team after completing online classes in which April learned how to work with Sara safely and effectively. But the connection was immediate the day they were matched.

"I felt called to be her handler," April says. "My family fell in love with her immediately. We brought her home that night."

April and Sara interact with staff and patients, allowing them to take a moment, pause from the pace of life and enjoy snuggling with her soft fur.

"Sara lets others feel their feelings and provides unconditional love," April states sagely. "There is never a doubt about how Sara feels and that makes people feel special."

The Power of the Dog

Dogs have the power to change lives. This is something long-time supporter Nan Stuart has observed first-hand through her own pet Golden Retrievers and dogs she has met through her philanthropic work. In 2023, Nan's giving brought two great passions together – Canine Companions and canine cancer. She created a fund to support our dogs who are facing cancer. This aligns with Canine Companions' research efforts to reduce cancer risk in our dogs.

"We are so thankful for Nan's long-time support and very humbled that she has established this important fund to help cover the costs of treatments for our dogs dealing with cancer," says Barbara Barrow, vice president philanthropy.

Serving Kids in Our Community

James and Nia

As James was getting older, he was having a hard time connecting with his peers beyond a simple "hello." James loves socializing but living with Down Syndrome and hearing loss makes it difficult to express the words he wants to share.

James' mom, Larkin, was already working hard on building an inclusive community for James and other children with disabilities through nonprofit work. Every year, she speaks to schools in her home state about disability, acceptance and inclusion. She knew that James needed someone to motivate him to express himself and connect with his community.

Canine Companions Service Dog Nia was the key to unlocking 10-year-old James' world. "James has something to talk about that others can understand," Larkin says. "His language and self-expression are developing more, and I think Nia has a lot to do with that. Nia makes him feel brave."

Down Syndrome causes low muscle tone, resulting in fatigue and poor stamina. Every night, Nia helps by cleaning up James' toys. She also helps him increase his activity, with James happily walking

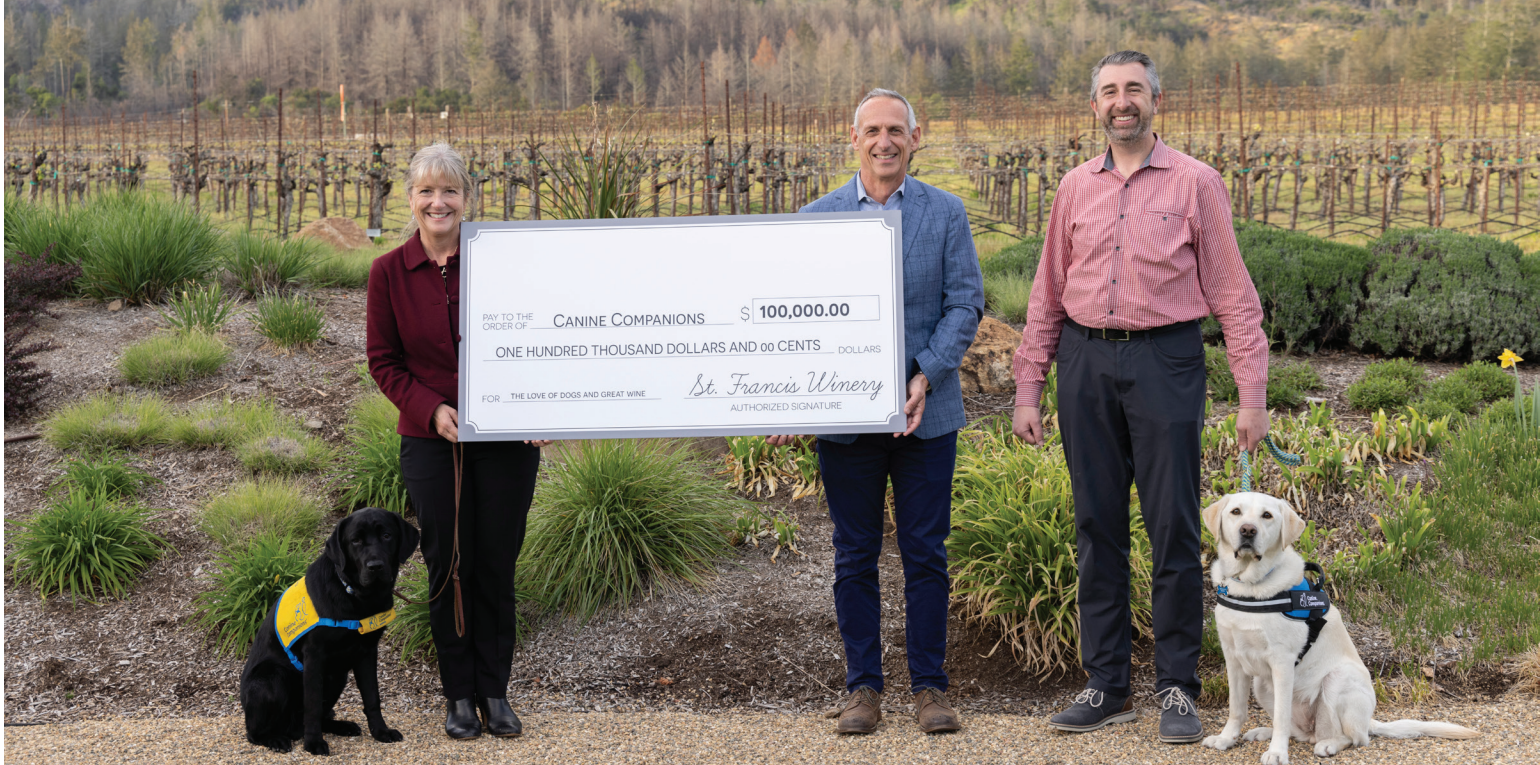
around the community, holding her harness along with Larkin.

"Nia has a secret power over him," Larkin remarks. "Being able to grab that harness handle motivates James to walk to class or in the grocery store."

James and his family have also received an unexpected gift from Nia – the inclusive Canine Companions community. For Larkin and James, graduating from Canine Companions was like joining a huge family.

Larkin sums it up: "There's no real way to understand all the good that comes from having a service dog, until you do. The community that comes with it and the amazingsness of the dogs is so special."
